

Meet Our New Pastoral Administrator: Fr. Andrew Rauenbuehler!

What were your thoughts when you learned that you were assigned to St. Mary's Parish?

I was very excited when I heard I was assigned to St. Mary's, but it was also very unexpected. Iowa City is a great place to be. Sometimes, it was hard thinking that I had to leave Davenport. I have kept in touch with some people that I had connections with back in Davenport--previous students, parishioners, etc.

Who is your favorite saint and why?

My favorite saint is St. Maximilian Kolbe who is also my Confirmation Saint. I have always been fascinated with World War II, but his story especially had an impact on me. Many Christians and priests died in World War II, and I have always been inspired by their commitment to serve their neighbor with their whole lives. St. Maximilian Kolbe is a great example of someone who served his neighbor when he took the place of a prisoner in the concentration camp.

What do you think is the biggest challenge facing teenagers?

I would say the biggest challenge facing teenagers is remembering that each life has a purpose given by God. It is easy to forget this because of the many distractions and hardships that we face in life. We can get caught up in social media and the world, and it is easy for them to think that their purpose is found in the world rather than in God. It becomes very easy to forget God. Life is fast-paced and full of distractions--everyone has to contend against things that can pull us away from God. But social media can also help us to remember God, and to stay connected to our faith.

What is your favorite Bible passage?

John 10:10: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Similar to the last question, this Bible verse helps us remember our desire in God for true happiness. God wants what's best for us and wants us to live a full life. God desires our joy. This is important to remember because we want God to love us, but He already loves us and wants us. Many people live life by looking for the next thing--and emptiness is always the result if the things of this world don't lead us to God. St. Augustine's quote of, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You" also has the same impact. St. Augustine lived his life looking for the 'next thing' until he found God.

Who is your biggest influence?

My parents. They have impacted me in both similar and different ways. Their strong commitment to faith, even in hard times, inspired me. We faced trials that brought our family together in faith. My dad came back to the Faith during marriage, and took his faith seriously. My parents had a serious commitment to their Faith. Faith has to be a part of everyday life, and has allowed them to keep their Faith in a hard world.

Did you have a job prior to being a priest?

Yes, I served as a medic in Davenport. Being a medic is very similar to the life of a priest--you never know what's gonna happen. I was a firefighter, but I preferred working in healthcare because it was more impactful.

What music do you listen to?

I listen to a little bit of everything! I enjoy hard rock, folk and acoustic music. My favorite band to listen to is Coldplay, especially their first two albums. My cousins and I also really enjoyed listening to Coldplay when we were younger.

Do you have any special devotions or consecrations?

I have prayed Marian Consecrations and I also love to pray the Rosary and read Scripture often. I also have always prayed a prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus that has become routine in my prayer life.

When did you decide you wanted to become a priest?


I decided to enter seminary in 2015 when, while working as a medic, I had a lot of pulls I felt back to back. I started to realize how much people need God by seeing the tragedies that come unexpectedly in life. When you come across people who are in need of help because of choices they have made, you can help them physically; but even more spiritually. I wondered, "Whose job is it to remind people to think about God wherever you are?"

The relationship I was in at the time ended as she moved back to Chicago and this gave God some space to connect the dots for me, and led me to realize that it was the priest who needed to meet the need of bringing Jesus to everyone. I spent a lot of time in prayer, and decided to try one year of seminary. The first few years were a struggle and felt uncertain at times. But at the end of each year, I kept finding a reason to come back and remain there. Some days, I didn't even know if it was for me. But half-way through my years in seminary, I felt that God was leading me. Once the Spirit led me, I felt happy and content.

What sport do you like the best? Do you or did you play a sport when you were our age? In my younger years, I enjoyed playing baseball and basketball, but baseball was my favorite. Football is my favorite sport to watch. I also love to play golf with my brother in my free time.

What is your favorite thing to eat?

Steak is my favorite thing to eat. For dessert, I love apple pie with either whipped cream or ice cream.
