


SACRED ART KEY † MAIN ALTAR

1	ST ANNE (WITH MARY) JUL 26TH	(1st cent. B.C1st cent A.D.) Patron saint of housewives and women in labor She was Mary's mother, wife of St. Joachim, and grandmother to Jesus
2	THE VISITATION MAY 31ST	Mary visits her cousin, Elizabeth (mother of John the Baptist) (Luke 1:39-56) "Blessed is she who believed that what was spoken to her by the Lord would be fulfilled"
3	ST PATRICK MAR 17TH	(5th centc.493) Patron saint of Ireland, Nigeria, and engineers He promulgated the Christian faith in Ireland
4 M	ST BONIFACE JUN 5TH	(675-754) Patron saint of Germany, brewers, and tailors He promulgated the Christian faith in Germany
5	ANGELS	The angels hold wheat (L) and grapes (R), representing the Eucharistic sacrifice
		GOSPEL WRITERS (THE FOUR EVANGELISTS)
6 M	ST MATTHEW SEP 21ST	(1st centc.74) Patron saint of accountants and tax collectors He was a tax collector and one of Jesus' twelve apostles
7 M	ST MARK APR 25TH	(1st cent68) Patron saint of lawyers and notaries He was one of Jesus' seventy disciples; he became Peter's interpreter/scribe
8 M	ST LUKE OCT 18TH	(1st centc.84) Patron saint of physicians, students, and artists He was a doctor, a Gentile, and disciple of Paul; he also wrote the Acts of the Apostles
9	ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST DEC 27TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of authors and friendship He was a fisherman, and thought to be the "beloved" apostle
		EARLY CHURCH FATHERS (THE FIRST FOUR DOCTORS OF THE CHURCH)
10	ST JEROME SEP 30TH	(c.340-420) Patron saint of translators, librarians, and historians He translated the Bible into Latin (The <i>Vulgate</i>), used by the Church until 1970
11	ST AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO AUG 28TH	(354-430) Patron saint of theologians, printers, and brewers He greatly influenced Christian philosophy and theology through his many writings
12	ST AMBROSE DEC 7TH	(340-397) Patron saint of bee keepers and beggars He introduced the practice of <i>lectio divina</i> and was known for his great eloquence
13	ST GREGORY THE GREAT SEP 3RD	(540-604) Patron saint of musicians, teachers, and students 164th Pope; He is credited with inventing Gregorian chant
14	LAMB AND SCROLL	The slaughtered lamb (Jesus) opens the seven-sealed scroll (Revelation 5:1-14)

		WEST ALTAR
1	MARY WITH INFANT JESUS	Mary, Queen of Heaven, holds the infant Jesus (with symbols of the 4 evangelists below)
2	ST BERNARD OF CLAIRVAUX	(1090-1153) Patron saint of candle makers, and Cistercians
	AUG 20TH	Doctor of the Church; He founded many monasteries and reformed the Cistercian order
3	ST BONAVENTURE	(1217-1274) Patron saint of bowel disorders
	JUL 15TH	Doctor of the Church; He wrote extensively and sought an integration of faith and reason
4	SACRED HEART OF JESUS	Modern devotion to the Sacred Hearth was revealed to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque
	19 DAYS AFTER PENTECOST	Fire emanating from the heart represents the transformative power of Divine Love
5	TABERNACLE	Houses the Body of Christ (Eucharist); celebrated on the Feast of <i>Corpus Christi</i>
	11 DAYS AFTER PENTECOST	"Jesus took a loaf of bread and said, 'Take, eat; this is my body.'" (Matthew 26:26)
6	MOSES THE PROPHET	(c.1400– c.1201 B.C.) "The Lord used to speak to Moses face to face." (Exodus 33:11)
	SEP 4TH	He led the Jewish people out of Egypt and received the Ten Commandments
7	DAVID THE KING	(c.1040- c.970 B.C.) "He administered justice and equity to all his people." (1 Chron 18:14)
	DEC 29TH	King of Israel for 40 years; he is said to have written much of the book of Psalms
8	ISAIAH THE PROPHET	(8th cent 7th cent. B.C.) "He has sent me to bring good news to the poor." (Isaiah 61:1)
	JUL 6TH	He foretold the virgin birth and described the mission and fate of the "suffering servant"
9	EZEKIEL THE PROPHET	(c.622- c.570 B.C.) "The heavens were opened and I saw visions of God." (Ezekiel 1:1)
	APR 10TH	He prophesized about the destruction of Jerusalem and the mercy/forgiveness of God
		EAST ALTAR
10	ST JOSEPH	(1st cent. B.C1st cent A.D.) Patron saint of workers, fathers, the dying, and the Church
	MAR 19TH	Carpenter, husband of the Virgin Mary, and adoptive father of Christ
11	ST ALOYSIUS GONZAGA	(1568-1591) Patron saint of Catholic youth, the blind, and AIDS patients/caregivers
	JUN 21ST	He died at the age of 23 while caring for patients with infectious diseases
12	ST ANTHONY OF PADUA	(1195-1231) Patron saint of travelers, the poor, and lost people/items
	JUN 13TH	Doctor of the Church; He is known for his gift of preaching and knowledge of scripture
13	HOLY FAMILY	Jesus (as a child), Mary, and St. Joseph spend time together as a family
	SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS	The Holy Family is the model and exemplar of all Christian families
14	DEATH OF ST JOSEPH	He is considered the model of the believer who receives grace at the moment of death

1	ST ROSE OF LIMA AUG 23RD	(1586-1617) Patron saint of Peru and South America She lived an austere life and invited the homeless, sick, and elderly into her home
2	BL KAROLINA KÓZKA NOV 18TH	(1898-1914) Patron of youth and farmers She was a Polish teenager who was murdered during World War I
3 M	ST MARGARET OF ANTIOCH Jul 20th	(289-304) Patron saint of pregnant women She was born of pagan parents and beheaded after refusing to worship Roman gods
4	ST FRANCIS DE SALES JAN 24TH	(1567-1622) Patron saint of writers, journalists, and the deaf He was a lawyer, missionary, and bishop. He wrote about the universal call to holiness
5	ST ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL JUL 4TH	(1271-1336) Patron saint of peacemakers She (Isabella) was extremely pious and was devoted to strangers, the sick, and the poor
6	ST BRIGID OF IRELAND FEB 1ST	(c.453-c.524) Patron saint of fugitives, and dairy & poultry farmers She (Bridget) was a nun who founded a monastery and a school for art
7	ST MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL SEP 29TH	(N/A) Patron saint of police, paramedics, and the military He is often portrayed as a protector and guardian of God's people
8	ST ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY	(1207-1231) Patron saint of Catholic Charities She was a princess who dedicated her life & wealth to serving the poor, sick, and aged
9	ST HELENA Aug 18th	(c.250-c.330) Patron saint of converts, divorcees, and archaeologists She was the mother of Emperor Constantine and found the True Cross
10	ST WILLIAM OF VERCELLI JUN 25TH	(1085-1142) Patron saint of Irpinia (a region in southern Italy) He lived an austere life as a hermit and founded the order of Monte Vergine
		APOSTLES
11 M	ST MATTHIAS MAY 14TH	(1st centc.80) Patron saint of alcoholics He was elected to replace Judas Iscariot as the twelfth apostle
12 M	ST SIMON OCT 28TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of tanners He was a missionary in Persia
13 M	ST JUDE OCT 28TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of lost causes He was a missionary in Persia
14 M	ST BARTHOLOMEW AUG 24TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of butchers He was a missionary in Armenia
15 M	ST PHILIP MAY 3RD	(1st cent80) Patron saint of hatters and pastry chefs He was a disciple of John the Baptist
16 M	ST PETER JUN 29TH	(1st centc.68) Patron saint of fishermen and the Papacy He was the first Pope and one of the three "inner circle" disciples. His name means "rock"

1 M	ST BARBARA DEC 4TH	(c.3rd centc.4th cent.) Patron saint of artillerymen, engineers, and miners She was beheaded by her pagan father, after he found out she had been Baptized
2	ST CLARE OF ASSISI AUG 11TH	(1194-1253) Patron saint of eye disorders and television She was a contemporary of St. Francis and founded a contemplative order (<i>Poor Clares</i>)
3	ST WOLFGANG OCT 31 ST	(934-994) Patron saint of those suffering from strokes and paralysis He initiated clerical reforms, lived an austere life, and had special concern for the poor
4 M	ST CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA NOV 25TH	(287-305) Patron saint of young women, students, and philosophers She was martyred (beheaded) after converting many Egyptian pagans to Christianity
5	ST ALOYSIUS GONZAGA JUN 21ST	(1568-1591) Patron saint of Catholic youth, the blind, and AIDS patients/caregivers He died at the age of 23 while caring for patients with infectious diseases
6	ST FRANCIS DE PAULA APR 2ND	(1416-1507) Patron saint of boatmen and mariners He founded the <i>Order of Minims</i> ("the lowest ones"). He was a hermit and a vegan.
7	ST FRANCIS XAVIER DEC 3RD	(1506-1552) Patron saint of missionaries One of the first Jesuits and a great missionary; he brought Christianity to India and Japan
8 M	ST AGATHA FEB 5TH	(230-251) Patron saint of breast cancer patients and protection against fire She was martyred (beheaded) for professing her faith and refusing to give up her virginity
9	GUARDIAN ANGEL W/ CHILD OCT 2ND	St. Jerome wrote that "each [soul] has from his birth an angel commissioned to guard it" "Do not despise one of these little onestheir angels continually see the face of my Father"
		APOSTLES
10	ST JOHN DEC 27TH	(1st centc.100) Patron saint of authors and friendship He was a fisherman, and thought to be the "beloved" apostle
11 M	ST JAMES THE LESS / JUST MAY 3RD	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of pharmacists and hat makers He was the first Bishop of Jerusalem, cousin of Jesus, and wrote the <i>Letter of James</i>
12 M	ST ANDREW NOV 30TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of fishermen, Scotland, Russia, and Romania He was St. Peter's elder brother and was crucified on an X-shaped cross
13 M	ST JAMES THE GREATER JUL 25TH	(1st centc.44) Patron saint of arthritis & Spain (pilgrimage of <i>Santiago de Compostela</i>) He was St. John's brother and part of Jesus' inner circle (along with Peter and John)
14 M	ST MATTHEW SEP 21ST	(1st centc.74) Patron saint of accountants and tax collectors He was a tax collector and wrote the <i>Gospel of Matthew</i>
15 M	ST THOMAS Jul 3rd	(1st centc.72) Patron saint of architects and India He doubted the resurrection, but believed upon touching the wounds of the risen Christ

1	ST ANTHONY OF PADUA JUN 13TH	(1195-1231) Patron saint of travelers, the poor, and lost people/items Doctor of the Church; He is known for his gift of preaching and knowledge of scripture
2	ANGELS	Angels are spiritual, non-corporeal (bodiless) beings, created by God Angels intermediate between God and man as spiritual messengers
3 M	ST PAUL THE APOSTLE JUN 29 TH	(1st cent1st cent) Patron saint of writers/authors and missionaries "Apostle to the Gentiles;" He wrote many of the letters in the New Testament
4	ST PATRICK MAR 17TH	(5th centc.493) Patron saint of Ireland, Nigeria, and engineers He promulgated the Christian faith in Ireland
5	PIETÀ	Depicts the Blessed Mother cradling the body of Jesus after his death
6	MARY WITH CHRIST CHILD	Mary cradles the infant, Jesus
		BALCONY
7	SANCTA CAECILIA ORGAN	Named after St. Cecilia (Nov 22nd feast day), patron saint of musicians It is the oldest pipe organ in Iowa City (installed 3/17/1883)
8	IMMACULATE CONCEPTION DEC 8TH	Depiction of the declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception (12/8/1854) Pope Pius IX declared that Mary was conceived without the stain of original sin
9	ST THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX OCT 1ST	(1873-1897) Patron saint of florists, sufferers of tuberculosis, and missionaries Doctor of the Church; She did small things with great humility & love to grow in holiness
10	OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE DEC 12TH	Mary appeared to a poor Mexican named Juan Diego in 1531 requesting a church be built This image of Mary miraculously appeared on Juan Diego's tunic, as a sign
